A ydych chi allan yn aml, a oes gennych chi blant ifanc?

- **A yw eich adeilad yn addas?**

A oes gennych chi fynediad hawdd at ardd, a ydych chi'n byw ger ffordd brysur, a yw fflat yn addas ar gyfer cadw'r math o anifail anwes sydd gennych dan sylw?

- **Beth fydd cost hyn i gyd?**

Mae anifeiliaid anwes yn gallu bod yn ddrud i'w cadw a'u bwydo. Beth am y costau annisgwyl fel biliau'r milfeddyg?

- **Materion iechyd – a oes milfeddyg lleol all ofalu am eich anifail anwes?**

Mae hyn yn neilltuo bwysig os oes gennych chi anifail anwes anarferol neu egsotig. A oes angen brechiadau rheolaidd?

- **A ydych chi am yswirio eich anifail anwes a/neu roi microsglodyn ynddo?**

Rydym yn annog hyn ond mae cost i'r ddau.

- **Beth fydd yn digwydd i'r anifail anwes os ydych i ffwrdd o'ch cartref, ar wyliau er enghraifft, i ffwrdd o herwydd salwch annisgwyl neu os yw CCG angen eich symud i eiddo arall?**

A oes gennych chi ffrindiau neu deulu sy'n fodlon ac yn medru gofalu am eich anifail anwes os nad ydych gartref?

- **Rheoli poblogaeth**

Os ydych yn bwriadu cadw cath gofynnwn i chi ei hysbaddu ac argymhellwn hyn ar gyfer cŵn ac anifeiliaid anwes eraill hefyd. Rydym yn ystyried gor-boblogaeth o anifeiliaid mewn cartref yn niwsans.

- **A fydd eich dewis o anifail anwes yn debygol o darfu ac achosi niwsans i'ch cymdogion?**

Mae'r mwyafrif ohonom yn dymuno byw'n gytun â'n cymdogion – gall fod yn syniad da cael sgwrs gyda nhw cyn i chi wneud y penderfyniad olaf ynglŷn â chadw anifail anwes / anifail yn eich cartref.

- **A oes gennych chi ddigon o ymroddiad i ofalu am eich anifail anwes?**

Er enghraifft:

- a oes gennych chi gynllun ar gyfer sut y byddwch yn gofalu am eich anifail anwes a'i reoli?
- rhaid mynd â chŵn am dro bob dydd ar dennyn – a yw'r amser a'r ymroddiad gennych i wneud hyn?
- ni ddylid gadael cŵn i gyfarth yn y tŷ neu'r ardd drwy'r dydd gan darfu ar bobl ac achosi niwsans rhaid clirio unrhyw lanast yn syth – oes gennych chi'r ymroddiad i wneud hynny?
- rhaid gofalu'n iawn am anifeiliaid ac mae hyn yn cymryd amser, ymdrech a chost

Rydym yn eich cynghori chi i ystyried yr uchod o ddifrif cyn penderfynu cadw anifail anwes yn eich cartref.

Pa anifeiliaid na chaniateir yn eich cartref?

- Anifeiliaid fferm, er enghraifft defaid, wŷn bach, geifr, moch, gwartheg, ceffylau, merlod, ieir, ffowlyn a hwyaid (mewn rhai achosion eithriadol fe ellir cael caniatâd i gadw ieir a hwyaid os yw'r eiddo'n addas ac os nad yw'r anifeiliaid yn creu niwsans neu ddifrod i'r eiddo gan gynnwys yr ardd).

Thinking of keeping a pet?

Before deciding to keep a pet Cartefi Cymunedol Gwynedd ask you to consider the following:

- **Does the pet fit your lifestyle and your family circumstances?**

Are you out a lot, do you have young children?

- **Is your accommodation suitable?**

Do you have easy access to a garden, do you live near a busy road, is a flat suitable for the type of pet you are proposing to keep?

- **How much is it going to cost?**

Pets can be expensive to keep and feed. What about unexpected costs such as vet bills?

- **Health issues - is there a local vet who can care for your pet?**

This is particularly important if you have a more unusual or exotic pet. Are regular vaccinations required?

- **Are you going to insure, and/or microchip your pet?**

We actively encourage this but they both cost money.

- **What will happen to the pet if you are away from home, for example on holiday, due to unexpected ill health or if we need to move you to another property?**

Do you have friends or family who are willing and able to care for your pet if you are not at home?

- **Population control**

If you are planning to keep a cat we will ask that it is neutered and we would recommend this for dogs and other pets as well. We regard over-population of animals in a home as a nuisance.

- **Is your choice of pet likely to cause nuisance or annoyance to your neighbours?**

Most of us want to live harmoniously with our neighbours – it may be worth having a chat with them before you make the final decision on keeping a pet / animal at your home?

- **How committed are you to looking after your pet?**

For example:

- have you got a plan on how you will care for the pet and control it?
- dogs need to be walked on a lead daily – do you have the time and commitment to do this?
- dogs should not be left to bark in the house or garden all day causing a nuisance
- any mess must be cleared up immediately – are you committed to doing this?
- pets and animals need to be looked after properly and this takes time, effort and has financial implications

We advise you to give serious thought to the above before deciding to keep a pet or animal.

Which animals are not allow in your home?

- Farm animals for example sheep, lambs, goats, pigs, cattle, horses, ponies, chickens, poultry and ducks. (In some exceptional circumstances however, consent may be given for keeping chickens and ducks provided that the property is suitable and that they do not cause nuisance, annoyance or damage to the property which includes the garden)

Thinking of keeping a pet?

- Animals registered under the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976 including types of poisonous snakes, specific types of spiders and reptiles including alligators and crocodiles
- Any dog specified under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 including Pit Bull Terrier, Japanese Tosa, Dogo Argentina, Fila Brazeliero
- Endangered species, such as certain birds of prey
